

The Division of General Pediatrics Grand Rounds

Senior Resident Role

The Division of General Pediatrics grand rounds occur on Monday mornings from 8-9 AM. There is a pediatrician assigned monthly to arrange the sessions. The 4th Monday of every month is reserved for a case of the month talk. The 2 senior residents on the wards will be responsible for presenting this talk. The presentation guidelines that were adopted by the residency training committee will be followed. These are outlined below.

- The resident should have a staff person assigned to supervise.
- The talk should be 30-40 minutes, with 20-30 minutes for discussion.
- The discussion should be facilitated by the resident with assistance from the assigned faculty.
- The topic should be of interest and beneficial to the resident and applicable to the audience. A list of previous topics should be available for the resident to review.
- The resident should become knowledgeable about their topic, appropriate to their level of training.
- It is recommended that the resident review two to three articles in preparation for the talk.
- The talk can be done “chalk board” style or with power point depending on the nature of the talk. This can be decided on in conjunction with the supervisor.
